## Another set of outstanding results for Bredhurst School!

The information below compares the attainment of our pupils with local authority and national averages. We are delighted with the excellent results across the school. They are a tribute to the children and the staff.

Please note that 2018 national and local comparative data is not available yet in the majority of cases (some 2018 KS2 comparisons are shown). The remaining comparisons will be posted on our website as soon as they become available. In the meantime 2017 data is shown.

## **Early Years Foundation Stage**

**80%** of pupils in Reception attained a Good Level of Development against the Early Years Framework. This is above the 2017 local authority average of **74%** and the national average of **71%**.

A Good Level of Development is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

### Year One Phonic Screening

94% of pupils in Year One attained the expected standard in the Phonic Screening test. This is above the 2017 national average **(81%)** and above the 2017 local authority average **(82%)**.
