

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back after the half term break!

Term 6 is always a manic term with lots to fit in. Sports day, sports week, leavers disco and end of year trip which all certainly help to keep us busy.

Next week our year 1 children will take part in the phonics screening, this is a fairly informal assessment. However the results are sent off to the DfE and we will be sent the % of pupils who have passed.

The end of year reports in July will have EYFS, Phonics, Year 2 and Year 6 assessments within them. These will be printed on a separate sheet. We do not get these results until 9th July so will aim to get them to you as soon as we are able to after that date.

The children have had a super time during 'outdoor week', slightly hampered by the torrential rain all day on Wednesday! Oscar Colyer—400m, Harry Shepherd—400m, Lucas Cameron—100m and Myles Cox- long jump. The year 5 + 6 team finished 2nd overall.

Our year 6 children took part in the Safety in Action on Thursday which they thoroughly enjoyed and our 2 teams came 1st and 3rd out of all the teams for that day.

This term the children have been introduced to an exciting new initiative that is being rolled out across the school. The Zones of Regulation are a tool which help everyone understand their emotions and gives them a toolbox of ideas which they can use to regulate themselves when not in the "zone" to learn. Each class has discussed the four different zones.-Blue, green, yellow and red. The children know that being in the green zone is where they will learn best. They are not "naughty" for being in the other zones, but that they need to be able to help themselves to get back into the green. Blue equates to being lethargic/tired, unwell or unfocused. Yellow is when you become excitable or irritable, maybe slightly out of control. Finally red, when we are out of control, angry and distressed. This is when we need others to help support our behaviour and give us strategies to calm before thinking about the consequences of our behaviour.

Some classes have used cartoon characters to help children relate to the colours. These include Minions, Mr Men and the characters from the film Inside Out. If you have any questions about the Zones please do not hesitate to ask your child's class teacher, Mrs place or Mrs Cox.
