Clarification of our SENCO—from Mrs Place

As the Special Educational Needs Coordinator, I am here to ensure that all of our children are able to access the teaching in class and to progress with their learning. I support the teachers to enable this to happen, and I am here for you to discuss any worries or concerns you may have surrounding your child. I can hopefully point you in the right direction if we need to liaise with outside agencies: such as Paediatrics, Speech and Language or Occupational Therapy and I ensure that those children who have been identified as needing greater support, above that of their peers, have the same opportunities whilst at Bredhurst. This may be concerning their ability to learn, an emotional need, a communication difficulty or a physical need.

I am in school two days a week, though the office will always forward any queries you have directly to me, so please feel free to contact me if you'd like to arrange a meeting or have a chat....the kettle is always on.

Next term we will be starting our weekly 1p collection for Mary's Meals. Your child can give there donation into the class-room or bring them to the office where a collection box has begun.
