Another set of outstanding results for Bredhurst School!

The information below compares the attainment of our pupils with local authority and national averages. We are delighted with the excellent results across the school. They are a tribute to the children and the staff.

Early Years Foundation Stage

83% of pupils in Reception attained a Good Level of Development against the Early Years Framework. This is above the 2019 local authority average of **75%** and the national average of **72%**. A Good Level of Development is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

Year One Phonic Screening

100% of pupils in Year One attained the expected standard in the Phonic Screening test. This is above the 2018 national average of **83%** and above the 2018 local authority average of **83%**
