Dear Parents and Carers,

I can hardly believe we are already at the end of the first term. It seems like our year R children have only just started and we are already at the first break. The children will be tired come the half term as being at school is hard work. There is so much to take in with all the new routines and the new environment. It was lovely to see so many parents able to come and watch them in their first class led worship - didn't they do a super job too! They have settled into school life so well, but definitely need the break next week to recharge. We also have some very tired children further up the school too, you can see some of them flagging as the end of the week has drawn nearer!

The children have enjoyed being back at school and are definitely making the most of the outdoor area at lunchtime. Having visited several other schools over the past couple of weeks it has made me realise quite how lucky we are to have such a big outside area for our children to play. We are continuing to use the field, whatever the weather - only if it pours down will the children be inside for lunchtime. We encourage the children to play together and resolve any issues which arise between them, we want our children to develop into resilient adults who are able to understand the viewpoint of others and to be able to negotiate. Part of the children's play is also around teaching them how to risk manage which is also a very important skill. The children are thoroughly enjoying den building and active play at lunchtime. In order to make this more fun for the children, if you have any: wooden pallets, tarpaulin, planks, cable wheels etc at home or in workshops or garages we would be very grateful if you could donate them for the children to be able to use in their play. Do you know that approx. 1 and half years of a child's primary education is spent playing during their 7 years at primary school? This is why it is so important we get it right and develop and build on these important skills. It is lovely watching them engage in play so enthusiastically and with such enjoyment and enthusiasm

Thank you to all the parents who attended Pumpkin Morning and gave up their time to run and manage stalls, donate food and drinks and help set up and clear away after. It was a great success with £2353.83 being raised. This year we are aiming on spending the money raised by the FOBS events which take place over the year to purchase new laptops for the children - ideally we would like to be able to purchase 32 so every child in a classroom can use an individual laptop for their IT learning. We are also hoping to be able to take the children to the theatre to watch Sleeping Beauty at the Hazlitt at Christmas, the cost of this will be in excess of £25 with transport, FOBS have agreed to fund some of this which will make more affordable. The money raised by FOBS and the hard work by Karen Shepherd, Francessa Peters and the rest of the FOBS team really does benefit each and every child in our school. Thank you to the team for their hard work.

Thank you for your attendance at Parents Evenings this week. We had our first school council meeting this term. The meeting was very productive with the children raising issues they felt relevant to the school at this time. The children would like new playground equipment to be purchased as the equipment they have now is looking very tired. They also discussed school dinners, eating in the hall as well as the clubs on offer in school. As a result of this first meeting we will be ordering new equipment for lunchtime and looking at where to eat at lunchtime. The children were amazing at listening to each others point of view and thinking about what would work across the whole school. It can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online or who they might be speaking to. But talking regularly, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed and mean that when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. It can help to:

Reassure them that you're interested in their life, offline and online. Recognise that they'll be using the internet talk to their friends. Ask your child to show you what they enjoy doing online or apps they're using so you can understand them.

Be positive but also open about anything you're worried about. You could say "I think this site's really good" or "I'm a little worried about things I've seen here."

Clubs will recommence on Tuesday 1st November when the children return to school after the Autumn half term break. The clubs will remain the same until the end of term two. The final day for clubs will be Friday 2nd December. Should the weather be awful and your child's club be unable to take place we will notify you by via the app (we are still working on trying to get sound when the notifications are sent out).
