What a very wet and blustery start we have had to the new term. It has come as real shock after the mild weather we have been having. School Jotter



You should have received a letter this week regarding school jotter 3. We have now reverted back to jotter 2!!!! You will need to delete the jotter 3 app off your mobile devices and re download jotter 2. You will need to find Bredhurst School once again to be able to access the messages and newsletters. I can only applogise for the inconvenience this has caused. Initially we were informed we would need to update to jotter 3 for our website and app as jotter 2 would no longer exist.

However the person who told us this (who no longer works for the company!) was not truthful - jotter 2 is still available and will not be going. Jotter 3 was to be an improvement on the jotter 2. However it had clearly not been tested thoroughly before being marketed. We experienced so many glitches and issues with it that it made it impossible for us to continue using. The final straw was that despite being able to set up groups for messages in Jotter 3, the messages were sent without sound! This was not a feature they were going to change! An alert without sound to alert you that you have a message is pretty useless (in my opinion!) After an extensive amount of phone calls we were informed we could revert back to jotter 2 for our website and our app! Please can you let any family members who were using the app prior to the change over to re-download the app and all should work as it did previously! Our website now needs updating once again as the updated information was put on the jotter 3 platform - we are updating pages with the information for this school year as quickly as we are able.

The children have returned after the Autumn break ready to start the next part of their learning. Our infant children have begin their new topics this term.

Fir Tree class have started the topic 'Let's Go For a Ride!' where they are learning about different modes of transport and will be exploring journeys they have taken. They will look at road, rail and sea modes of travel. They we will be learning about significant people from the past and finding out who invented the car, plane and train and how this changed lives.

Forge class have begun their new topic of 'London's Burning!' They will be reading some fantastic books which delve into the fire from different character's perspectives to help understand what lots of people thought about the fire and what they experienced. They will be exploring the role Samuel Pepys had in The Great Fire of London and how, because of the event, life changed in London after much of it was devastated by the catastrophic fire. As part of their PHSE curriculum on being safe Forge class are learning the pants rule and the names for body parts - do not be alarmed if they come out with the correct name for parts of their anatomy! Don't forget to keep reading to your children, the book case outside Fir Tree classroom is available at both the beginning and end of the school day. You can also visit the book case in your child's class if they are in the Junior classes or your child can select the book they would like you to read to them. Reading to children is such an important part of the journey of learning to read and loving books. If your child comes how wearing a sticker with a grapheme on it please ask them what it says as this is the grapheme they may have found tricky at school. All adults around school are asking the children what the grapheme is if they have a sticker. The aim is to commit these to the children's long term memories and repetition helps with this. We can see a real improvement in children's phonic knowledge and understanding already since beginning the Little Wandle scheme.

Thank you for your support and hard work with this. It is paying off!

On Tuesday we were visited by the Maidstone Lions Rotary Club who have presented the school with a Automated External Defibrillator. This is an excellent donation to our school for the safety of our children we are very grateful indeed. This will be placed in the school hall and every member of staff will have training.
