Dear Parents and Carers,

The school looked very different again today, with everyone dressed up for Children in Need. We had spotty outfits, Pudsey ears and lots of bright coloured clothes. Thank you for you all for your support for this very worthy cause. We raised £102. The week started with odd socks and ended with spotty ears!

As it was friendship week this week, the children were all reminded about what to do if someone is unkind to them and how to help if they see someone being unkind. They were reminded how to be a good friend and how a good friend behaves. Forge class led us in a thoughtful worship about what to do if you are being bullied or someone is unkind to you. Hopefully the message has been reinforced this week with the children being reminded to get an adult to help them if someone does or says something to them that they do not like, as we can only deal with things if we know they are happening, They have been told to tell an adult at school or home to help them should this happen. The children across the school are very good at looking out for each other and are very inclusive in their play. Look at the lovely pictures on our twitter feed of several of them busy playing this week, they looked so content, happy and engrossed in their play.

We have a busy few weeks coming up with the run up to Christmas. Christmas is always a very busy, full on time in school, with rehearsals for nativities, cards to be made, parties, the Pantomime, discos, gift sales...the list seems endless! The children are all more than ready for a break by the end of the Christmas term. I am outlining the events which are coming up with a few details of each as I know how as parents how many things you have to try to juggle as parents.

Christmas tree decorations will continue to be on sale after school, at the cost of 50p each. Your child will need to bring their decoration into school on Friday 2nd December to hang on the Christmas tree during the Advent Event whilst we sing carols. All are welcome to join us for this. We will also be watching Sleeping Beauty at the Hazlitt that day, all children will need to order a school packed lunch or bring in a packed lunch from home as we will be back too late for a hot meal.

There will be a preloved Christmas jumper sale on the playground after school on Monday 5th December, all proceeds to go to Save the Children. The children will be able to wear their Christmas jumper to school on Thursday 8th December, as this is the day for the Save the Children Christmas Jumper Appeal, we are asking for donations of £1 in order to wear a Christmas jumper. The UK government has pledged to double donations this year, for every £2 they will also give £2. The children can also wear their Christmas jumper on the school Christmas dinner day, which will be Wednesday 14th December. This is also Christmas Disco date - a separate letter is to follow regarding this event. Next week the infant children will come home with a letter outlining the details for the nativity.

On Tuesday 6th December at 2.30pm and Wednesday 7th December at 4p.m our infant children will be performing their nativity. We do not like to have to limit the amount of people who come to watch this as children only get to perform in an infant nativity 3 times in their lives. These moments are very special to parents and grandparents alike. We do however ask that you only attend 1 performance, although you may have other family members attending the other performance. Hopefully, we will be able to accommodate all those who would like to watch their children in the play. We may have to go to standing room only but we will do our best to fit everyone in. We will ask that where possible you do not bring younger siblings as although they do like to watch their older brother or sister they can often make quite a lot of noise which puts other children off.

On Friday 9th December our FOBS team will be very busy in the school hall organising the Christmas Gift Sale. The gifts will range from approx. £1 to £4 and there will be a range of gifts for all members of the family. The children will need to bring in money in a named purse or envelope and gift bags for their gifts to go in.

Monday 12th is our Rock, Steady concert for our children who have been taking part in these lessons, at 2.30 in the school hall. This will also be the date of our Key Stage 2 Christmas Performance, which will take place at St. Matthew's church at 6pm. All children will be asked to arrive by 5.45 for a 6.00 start. The children have auditioned for roles this week and will soon beginning learning their lines and songs.

Our final day of the term will be Friday 16th December. We will finish the term with a Bethlehem walk, looking for the beautiful nativity signs hand painted by Ms Barton and hopefully finishing off with a hot chocolate. The afternoon will be Christmas parties where the children will bring in a small plate of party food for them to eat at the party. This will need to wrapped in foil/cling film and clearly labelled with your child's name (disposable plates would be preferable).

I know this may all seem very early as we are only in the middle of November but it will soon creep up on us!

Our annual **Fireworks Display** went with a bang! We had very positive feedback, with everyone seeming to enjoy themselves. We made a staggering £2,500 profit for the school, this money will go towards home reading books for your children to enjoy with you. Thank you to all the parents who helped to man stalls, set up before the event and stayed behind to tidy up.

We will be taking in donations of **New Toys** for the **Salvation Army Christmas Appeal from the week beginning 28th November**. Please only donate if you can afford to do so. There is no pressure for you to donate to this appeal, we are very aware of how the cost of living has gone up and how many people may be struggling to make ends meet.
