Dear Parents and Carers,

What a busy week! We have had 2 sporting events this week and a visit from the police!

On Wednesday, eleven of our year 5 and 6 children put themselves forward to represent the school in the cross country, despite the forecast of heavy rain! All the children ran very well, especially as it was the first cross country most of the children have run in, due to the impact of covid over the past couple of years. The course was 1.4km and was held at Cliffewoods School. It is 1 of 3 to be held as part of a cross country league. We actually held the title for the boys for this league 4 years ago; pre pandemic. In the year 5 race, Mikel Sage came in an incredible 1st place, with a clear 10 second lead, absolutely smashing the competition. Ella Hyland came in an impressive 11th place and Luke Wallace 13th. Austin Humphries and Lucas Wood gave it their all and battled to the end with two good runs. In the year 6 race Amalie Cameron was our highest ranked runner, coming in at 12th place after being sent off course by a marshall. The children all ran their absolute best and did not give up. Well done to all our children who took part and represented the school so well.

On Thursday our year 3 and 4 children took part in a football tournament at Greenfields School. Rory Hall and Oscar Hyland played very well, working hard in all their matches and not giving up. The stand out player from the tournament for our school was Dominic Carr, who played in goal for his first time and was brilliant! The fair play award goes to Jessica Campbell-Carr who worked incredibly hard in every match she played, she supported the rest of her team mates and came on or off the games when subs were needed with a smile on her face. Mr Peters and Mrs Bristow said you were all a credit to the school and played your little socks off! Well done to you all!

Mr Tickner (Ellis in year R's dad) and a colleague arrived at school in a police car yesterday to show Fir Tree class, as part of their topic on 'Let's Go for a Ride!' where they are learning all about different types of transport. The rest of the school also wanted to get in on the action, so every class came out to look at the police car and hear about life in the police force. If your child is late coming into school (after 9.15) and they require a school dinner please do contact us to let us know so we can make sure a dinner is ordered for them. As you maybe aware we do not have our own kitchen to cook meals, we only have a small servery. Our school dinners are ordered first thing in the morning and cooked at another local school.

All children whose parents filled out the consent form had their nasal flu vaccine today. Do check the leaflet which was sent home should they have any symptoms. It did seem to be a very straightforward, quick and painless procedure for them!
