Dear Parents and Carers,

We have now reached the end of Term 3, and hopefully the end of the cold weather. It will be lovely returning to school knowing Spring is on it's way.

The children have continued to work hard throughout this term on their learning. Fir Tree and Forge class will be starting new topics next term. Fir Tree class's new topic will be 'Digging for Dinosaurs.' They will be learning about how a palaeontologist discovers fossils. They will find out where dinosaurs lived and what led them to become extinct, as well as considering the impact they had on the world. They will be sculpting their favourite dinosaurs using clay and papier-mâché and making homes for them to live in.

Forge class will be beginning their new topic 'Land Ahoy!' with an immersive visit to Chatham Dockyard, where they will get to explore some of the amazing ships docked there and get to meet some pirates! They will learn about some famous pirates through their English work and discover what life as a pirate may have been like.

Hurstwood, Kemsley and Oakwood classes will continue with their current topics, enabling them to embed and build upon their knowledge so far.

Thank you to all the parents who attended the parents evenings on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. We will be using the results from the parents surveys to help us to build in the workshops you would like us to hold and other opportunities for you to be able to come into school to support your child on their learning journey. The most popular workshops were Maths and 'What does expected look like?' The shared activity with your child was the most popular with almost 3/4 of parents selecting this. We will be planning activities for Term 5 for each class—at separate times. The most popular times were 9am-10am and 5pm-6pm. We aim to hold our first workshop next term, so watch this space!

As a school we have recently updated our Relationship and Health Education policy. This can be found on our website policy page. Please have a look and contact us if you have any comments regarding the content of our Relationship and Health Curriculum We call this Life Skills as within these lessons we teach the children the skills needed for them to flourish. We welcome all feedback as this helps us to teach a curriculum which meets the needs of our children.

A group of 8 children from years 5/6 attended the table tennis Mini Youth Games yesterday, I am very proud to share with you the lovely news that they were the winners of the Fair Play Award. This award is voted by all the schools who attend. Our children were incredibly well behaved, showed excellent manners and sportsmanship throughout the day. They were an absolute credit to the school. They finished in 18th position, which they were a little disappointed by, but they all played to the best of their abilities and all enjoyed the opportunity. We now have a 'Fair Play' trophy in our trophy cabinet.

Our KS2 football team suffered a very disappointing defeat on Monday, losing 9-0, knocking us out of the cup. I am proud of everyone of them however as despite the bitter disappointment they held themselves high and persevered to the end of the match. Every child who played should feel proud of themselves for the determination and resilience they showed, they supported each other and all tried their best. The other team on this occasion were simply better and was also made up of all year 6 children, who were older and physically bigger players, which does also make a difference.

Thank you to Oakwood class for beginning our Safer Internet Day with their class led worship, in which they reminded us what a wonderful world the internet can be, but also reminded the children that they can and should report any thing which makes them feel unsafe whilst on -line. They reinforced the message of talking to parents about their online life.
