Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now at the end of Term 4 and what a busy term it has been! This term we taken part in several sporting events: the cross country league, where Mikel Sage won the league for year 5 boys for the whole of Medway, the junior football team played several league games and were unfortunately knocked out of the league, we had some friendly football matches and our infant team finally played their match against Allington winning 4-1, with Harper Horton scoring 3 goals and Freddie Benton scoring 1. They also played against Snodland this week drawing 3-3. Mr Peters said they were incredibly unlucky not to win but they all played brilliantly. We also had the gymnastics display earlier in the term where children were chosen to show their gymnastics skills. The rugby team took part in the Mini Youth Games tag rugby competition on Thursday this week losing 1 game, drawing 1 game and winning 6 games. The children all took part in an Irish dancing workshop on Wednesday.

As well as all the sports this term we have had visits and events in school. Our year 6 children went to St. Matthew's church for the Experience Easter workshops, we visited Rochester Cathedral, castle and the museum having taken part in the Diocese peace project. We celebrated World Book Day, with the children and staff dressing as an array of different characters from the books they have read. We had a charity cake sale raising £115.58 for My Shining Stars and took part in Red Nose Day raising £94.50. Several children took part in our annual talent competition, where the talent we have in our small school literally blew us away. I am aiming to put the videos of the children who took part on our YouTube channel over the Easter break. The choir sang at The Central Theatre in the Medway Schools Choir. The children who have been taking part in Rock, Steady had the opportunity to perform in front of their parents. We finished a very busy term with a wonderful Easter service, led very well by our year 6 children. Fir Tree class finished the service with their song 'Spring Chicken'. The term ended with our Easter Egg Hunt, which so many parents came to join us for and we even had a visit from the Easter Bunny! Thank you to Mrs Adamson who organised the hunt making all the clues and buying the stickers etc.

I think all the children deserve a much needed rest after such a busy term!

The current topic learning has now been completed and every class will begin new topics next term. I have been particularly impressed with some of the art work around school this term. Fir Tree made some beautifully detailed clay dinosaurs, Forge class produced wonderful pirate ship pictures using a variety of techniques and skills and Oakwood class produced some careful art work in the style of Henry Moore. Our new topics are:

Fir Tree class will start their topic Splish, Splash, Splosh! Where they will be learning about the weather and looking at the impact some weathers have on our world. They are going to monitor and check the weather patterns in the UK with their own handmade gauges and create their own weather stations. Look out for some budding weather presenters!

In Forge class the children will begin their topic, Bredhurst V Peru, by watching The Story of Paddington Bear. Paddington is from Peru, a country located in South America; it is this country, and then more specifically a small area within it, that they will explore the human and physical geographical features of. They will compare and contrast these features to our locality of Bredhurst and see whether these places are similar or different. They will be developing their knowledge of these two specific locations using maps, images and non-fiction texts.

Hurstwood class will be learning about how over 130 pyramids have been discovered in Egypt, the largest of which weighs as much as 16 Empire State buildings! In this topic they will learn about where Ancient Egypt fits with other early civilisations and events in Britain at the same time. They will learn about changes in how the country was ruled and how society developed over time looking at pyramid building, trade, conflict and daily life. Their English will be linked to the topic by reading Cinderella of the Nile.

Kemsley class are starting their new topic of Ancient Benin- A lost Kingdom. There have been many discoveries of lost kingdoms throughout the world and Ancient Benin in West Africa is one of them. In their learning, they will discover what their civilisation was like and how they grew together to become an important and powerful empire, known throughout the medieval world. They will link and contrast the events in this part of the world, to their previous learning about Anglo-Saxons and Viking settling in Britain. In addition, they will consider how and why the empire came to an end. They will ask questions about the sources of evidence that we use and learn about traditions, religion and customs. They will be using The White Giraffe, set in South Africa, by Lauren St John as their novel and a stimulus for some writing as well as learning the art of traditional oral storytelling to pass on stories and rhymes and songs.

Oakwood class are staring their new topic of European Mountains, using Frankenstein as their starting point to learn about some of the famous mountains and mountain ranges of Europe. They will understand how these natural structures form and what actually constitutes a mountain. They will undertake a regional study of a chosen European mountain environment and consider how it plays an important role in the environment and economic process of the planet. They will learn about both the physical and human geography of this environment and how mountains have a profound influence on not only their local climate but also areas hundreds and, sometimes, even thousands of miles away.

### Next term:

We are aiming for swimming to start at the beginning of May, depending on the weather - it needs to warm up significantly before the children start to swim! A timetable will be sent out nearer the time, your child will come into school in their PE kits on their swimming day. Parent helpers will also be needed!

Next term is always a short term, especially as we have SATs for years 2 and year 6 in the middle of the term. This term we also have an additional Bank Holiday to celebrate the King's Coronation.

Some of the events we have planned for next term include:

- A maths workshop for parents, where we will be demonstrating and explaining how we teach the children the four operations: addition, subtraction, division and multiplication from years 3 –6. This will take place in the school hall from 5.00 6.15. **No children please.**
- We will be holding a stay and learn session where each class will be inviting their parents/grandparents to join us for an afternoon,
   where each class will be making something related to the coronation.
