

Dear Parents and Carers,

I can hardly believe we are already at the end of the first term. It seems like our year R children have only just started and we are already at the first break. The children will be tired come the half term as being at school is hard work. There is so much to take in with all the new routines and the new environment. It was lovely to see so many parents and grandparents watching Fir Tree class in their first class led worship - didn't they do a super job too! They spoke so clearly and their song 'Little Red Hen' was adorable! Our year R children have settled into school life so well, but definitely need the break next week to recharge. We also have some very tired children further up the school too, you can see some of them flagging as the end of the term and the end of the week has drawn nearer!

The children have enjoyed being back at school and are definitely making the most of the outdoor area at lunchtime. Part of my job as a Headteacher includes visiting other schools and working alongside other Head Teachers. Having visited several other schools over this term it has made me realise quite how lucky we are to have such a big outside area for our children to play. We are continuing to use the field, whatever the weather - only if it pours down will the children be inside for lunchtime. The children will need to bring a pair of wellies into school if they wish to play on the field to prevent their school shoes and the school from becoming too muddy! We have

been sorting out our wellies this week and do have some spare ones in school. We will need a couple of new boot racks again for the spare boots to live. If you or anyone you know has the time to make us some please do let us know. We do encourage our children to play together and resolve any issues which arise between them; we want our children to develop into resilient adults who are able to understand the viewpoint of others and to be able to negotiate, this and teaching children to risk manage is all a part of children's play and learning. Did you know that approx. one and half years of a child's primary education is spent playing during their seven years at primary school? This is why it is so important we get it right and develop and build on these important skills. It is lovely watching them engage in play so enthusiastically and with such enjoyment.



Thank you to all the parents who attended Pumpkin Morning and gave up their time to run and manage stalls, donate food and drinks and help set up and clear away after. It was a great success with £2473 being raised. Thank you to Hannah Jones, who did a fantastic job in running and managing her first event, it all went incredibly smoothly. This year we are planning on spending the money raised to purchase new laptops for the children and pay for any repairs to the swimming pool pump. As the children are likely to be spending more time on technology over the next week, please can I take this opportunity to remind you about keeping them safe on line. Technology can be amazing and has certainly changed the world we live in, but it can also be a dangerous place for children. It can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online or who they might be speaking to. But talking regularly, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed and mean that when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. It can help to:

- Reassure them that you're interested in their life, offline and online.
- Recognise that they'll be using the internet talk to their friends.
- Ask your child to show you what they enjoy doing online or apps they're using so you can understand them.
- Be positive but also open about anything you're worried about.
- You could say "I think this site's really good" or "I'm a little worried about things I've seen here."

Flu Immunisation for all the children will take place in school on Friday 24th November.






Our Advent Event will also take place on Friday 1st December, where you are welcome to join us singing Carols on the playground. More information will follow.

#### ATTENDANCE!

There are 190 days in a school year, which leaves 175 days to spend time with the family, shopping, dentist appointments and other things. At Bredhurst, our attendance target is to achieve higher than 95%. Frequent absence can add up to a lot of missed learning time and can seriously disadvantage your child in adult life. How does your child compare?

Attendance (Academic Year)	Equals this many days absent	Equals this many weeks absent (approx.)	Equals this many lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	60 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	120 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	180 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	240 lessons
70%	57 days	12 weeks	360 lessons

Good attendance at school is essential for a child's education and establishes a positive working ethos early in life. It has been proven by DfE studies that students who are absent from school do not reach their full potential when measured against those that have a higher attendance percentage.
