Dear Parents and Carers,

We have now reached the end of Term 3, but unfortunately it seems not the end of the cold weather. It looks like the cold and wet will be continuing through the half term and when we return after the break. At least the days will be longer and Spring will hopefully be around the corner.

The children have continued to work hard throughout this term on their learning. Both Fir Tree and Forge class will be starting new topics next term. Fir Tree class's new topic is all about animals! They will be exploring pets, wild animals and their favourite creatures: large and small. They will be using class texts and non-fiction books to explore facts about them as well as creating their own creatures using clay. They will be planning, making and designing an animal home for their clay animals. Forge class will be beginning their new topic 'Nature's Gifts' where they will be looking at nature, weather, the outside world and their surroundings. They will be investigating plants and will have the opportunity to think of an experiment to establish what plants need to grow. In Geography, they will be revisiting physical and human features and looking at those that are in our local environment.

Yesterday, Mikel Sage, Neriah Bayode, Amelia Martin, Maya Kyle, Luca Suvari and Luke Wallace attended the table tennis Mini Youth Games. They were impeccably behaved, showing excellent manners and sportsmanship throughout the day. Their behaviour was commented on by several of the adults organising the tournament; they stood out for their sportsmanship and politeness. They were an absolute credit to the school. They were very unlucky with the draw and several matches could have gone either way with our children missing out by a point or two. Overall they finished in 19th position, which they were a little disappointed by, but every child played to the best of their abilities and all enjoyed the opportunity.

This week was children's mental health week. We started the week reminding the children of the key message from Captain Wonderweb: Food, Rest, Exercise and Devices as well as reminding them of the type of activities they can do to help their mental health. Next term we are making a change to the curriculum for our year 1 children. The children from Fir Tree and Forge will be taught maths altogether as a year group. The aim of this is to help them with their transition into year 2 and to ensure that they are ready for the next stage of their learning. It will also enable us the opportunity to work with the Year R children on their own curriculum and help to better prepare them for the transition into year 1.

Well done to all our year R, 1 and 2 parents who have been accessing the Big Cat Readers. There is a direct correlation between the children who are accessing the books the most and the children's progress and attainment in reading. Those who have read the most have achieved the higher scores in our recent assessments of the children's reading. We are aware that it is not ideal having to access books on a tablet or computer and we would much rather be able to send home a paper copy of the book your child is reading. We are looking at how we can do this to enable children reading at home to become an easier task.

Congratulations to James Wallace and Ruby Fifield our 2 winners of the Bee collage competition run by Chartwells our catering company. They both receive a seed planting kit.

The standard was very high and the competition was a challenge to judge. All the entries will be on display in school and also on the website. Well done to all the children who took part with beautiful colourful pictures.

Don't forget clubs start again on the first day back at school (Monday 19th February), these are the same clubs as last term. I hope you all have an enjoyable and restful break ready for the busy Easter term ahead!
